Child Care Bulletin (CBB) 24-16: Informal Directive of Assembly Bill 393 Implementation

CSPP question- for toddler enrollment in CSPP with IFSP, can we use adjustment factor for exceptional needs? Yes, you can.

Any update on Hold Harmless? CDSS hasn't received any updates.

There is a new program monitoring tool at CDSS. Download it. Don't wait until it is time for a review.

Does CDE or CDSS have any power to help speed up the permit process? CDE and CDSS have no authority or influence over that process.

CSPP question- new 9600 has Language instrument included. Do we need to use current language instrument also in addition to new 9600? Amy – if you use current 9600 have to do appendix. If you use what you have it can be comparable. As long as everything you see on new 9600 and appendix is on what you are using. Same info being captured.

Do we need to re-do applications, or when is new form effective? Amy – don't go back on a 9600. New enrollments use new 9600 or equivalent.

ADVOCATE WITH KEY DECISION-MAKERS, CPAC & THE DEPARTMENT OF EARLY CHILDHOOD (DEC) GOAL: Establish a consistent and transparent line of communication between CPAC, government officials and DEC prioritizing CPAC member needs.

Legislative Highlights (open ended)

Ask DEC for update on Prop C.

AB 1930 Reyes: Teaching credentials: Child Development Associate Teacher Permit: renewal.

Q- Previously there was a requirement that you could only hold an Associate Teacher Permit for a max of Ten Years. One renewal of the permit and you had to take a certain amount of ECE and general education classes and it was not possible for everyone to get to the Teacher permit level.

Answer- They would also then lose the ability to "be left alone with children" because they lost their permit and as Monica and Amy shared you need an Associate Teacher Permit to be left alone with children

CTC (Commission on Teacher Credentialing) hasn't released guidance on the implications
